PFAS Public Participation Grant

WIWSA has applied for a further two year <u>Public Participation Grant</u> for public education and participation in cleanup of PFAS in groundwater. We should know by the end of June whether we have received the grant.

PFAS News

The past month has been a busy time for PFAS. The Attorney General, Bob Ferguson, filed a lawsuit against 20 manufacturers of "forever chemicals", while Chemours, DuPont, and Corteva reached a settlement in the South Carolina AFFF multi-district litigation. We analyzed these lawsuits and settlements here: Lawsuit week for PFAS - by John Lovie - Mostly Water (substack.com)

The State Office of Drinking Water managed to have included in the Governor's Budget an Alternative Water Supply Decision Package, which should make funding available for testing and more for systems and private well owners with PFAS detections. Many details are yet to be worked out. We will share information as soon as it is available.

In case you missed it, Washington State Department of Health has published three great <u>educational</u> videos on PFAS.

DOH has also published a PFAS Testing Results Dashboard, which is a great resource.

The State Department of Ecology has begun to investigate groundwater contamination around **Harrington Lagoon** on Whidbey and **Mabana Shores** on Camano. Ecology has added the Island County sites to the site map.

We're working with the State Department of Health, the Climate Change Action Committee, and the State Department of Ecology on several public meetings and workshops on Whidbey and Camano Islands.
