## News from Whidbey Island Water Systems Association

#### **Board of Directors**

#### PFAS Public Participation Grant

WIWSA's application for a further two year Public Participation Grant for outreach on PFAS was not awarded. All payment requests, progress, and closeout reports have been submitted and final payments received and disbursed. We will produce a final report for the membership.
