Meeting Attendance

Some of you may recall that we had to repeat last December's annual meeting in January because of an insufficient number of members in attendance. The Seahawks game might have been a factor too, but we can't always schedule around that. Hybrid meetings seem to be less than satisfactory for both in person and online attendees.
