News from Whidbey Island Water Systems Association

Group B Meet-up in March, and Membership Drive

WIWSA is kicking off a Group B membership drive this month with a postcard mailing to the approximately 500 Group B water systems on Whidbey Island. The postcard is an introduction to those who don't know about Whidbey Island Water Systems Association and our community. We are inviting newcomers along with existing Group B members and newsletter subscribers, to attend a Group B Meet-up on March 14, 2024 from 5 pm to 6:30 pm on Zoom. The meeting will provide more information about WIWSA and the County's role before focusing on current issues that are affecting our small water systems.

Group B systems share some of the challenges faced by larger water systems but have unique issues, many of which might be resolved by sharing information and best practices with each other. WIWSA is in a good position to facilitate sharing by providing a forum through the website, this newsletter and the member meetings, supported by connections to experts when needed.

We hope that some new water systems will decide to apply for membership and help strengthen the association as a resource for the Group B community. As a further incentive, new members who join by March 31st will have their 2024 dues waived, they won't see a bill until next year.

Home Owner Association Registrations

Just a reminder to HOAs to keep your state registration up to date. We've had reports of some associations not following their bylaws to keep current with the secretary of state registrations. They may be at risk of losing some of their legal authority to manage their water systems. Scholarship/Apprenticeship Program

PFAS News & Events

The Navy held two Open House Public Meetings on February 1st, 2024. There was a good summary <u>published in the South Whidbey Record</u>. You can also read about it in a <u>recent post</u> by John Lovie at Mostly Water.

The Naval Air Station will expand testing to include areas south of the Area 6 Landfill this year. Property owners who drink water from a well on a property located within the sampling area may request sampling by calling **1-844-WHI-PFAS (1-844-944-7327)** and leaving a message, or by sending an email to **naswi.pfas@jacobs.com**. News from our Partners

Island County

- The <u>Hydrogeology Dashboard</u> has seen regular updates and recently an addition was made to the Interactive Maps options. There is a new tab for **Long-Term Monitoring Wells** which displays the location of sixteen long-term monitoring wells. Twelve wells are located on Whidbey Island and four on Camano Island. There is water level data available from the wells but the interface doesn't yet link the map view to the data. More to come!
- The county held open houses on the **2025 Comprehensive Plan** over the past few weeks to inform the public about the planning process and to solicit comments and feedback. The plan will be completed in June 2025 and you'll be able to follow the progress by visiting the county's <u>Comprehensive Plan page</u> on their website. On that same page you can make comments, provide feedback and take any of the several surveys available. It's still early in the process and the best time to weigh in.
- Island County is also conducting a **Community Health Survey** through the end of April. This is an online survey and according to the county's flyer:

"The results of the survey will identify areas of improvement and set a path towards creating a healthier community for all. There are questions about quality of life, access to health care, how people get health-related information, and what are some of the barriers to good health in our county. The more people we hear from, the more complete our picture will be of how Island County community members are doing."

You can find the survey here. It's expected to take an estimated 10-12 minutes to complete.
