News from Whidbey Island Water Systems Association

March Quarterly Member's Meeting Recap

Our most recent Member Meeting was held last month with 45 participants attending by zoom and featuring sessions on **SMA Service Levels** with NW Natural/King Water and a recap of **A Day with DOH** held earlier the same week from the Office of Drinking Water.

Silas Olson gave a review of the NW Natural acquisition of King Water and talked about some of the developments during the past year. Already there have been extensive improvements to both the office administration and operations as part of a move to a new location that is underway. They are attempting to respond to communications issues and described changes that are being made. Several members expressed appreciation of recent service actions and that improvements have been noticed.

Alexis Medina from the DOH Office of Drinking Water also presented at the Q1 Member's Meeting, discussing the annual *A Day with DOH* hosted by PNW/AWWA on March 20, 2024. Alexis summarized each of the topics from the day's agenda which you can find at Day with DOH webpage.

Group B Meet-up

Thank you to all who attended the <u>WIWSA Group B Meetup</u> last month. We had 24 attendees (from 17 water systems) for a discussion of common issues faced by members of Group B water systems, joined by John Lovie, and Island County staff members Aneta Hupfauer and Chris Kelley. Two presentations were given by Mitch Allen on <u>WIWSA</u> and Aneta Hupfauer on <u>Group B Roles</u> and <u>Responsibilities</u> which can also be found on the website.

During Aneta's presentation there were discussions that raised some points to keep in mind. In particular, keep your own records and protect your source well with the proper covenants.

The rest of the meeting was a discussion during which people asked questions and raised issues including:

- Storage tank cleaning: how often and how to clean
- Issues finding contractors and SMA support
- Reserve planning
- Water quality testing
- PFAS testing for small systems

It was generally agreed that the meeting was helpful and something we want to do again. We will check in with the group that registered for this meeting in a few months to schedule the next meetup. Invitations for all future meetings will be sent out to all newsletter subscribers who have indicated that they belong to a Group B water system when subscribing.

Reminder: Lead Service Line Inventory due October 16, 2024

Once again, a reminder to Group A systems that there is an **upcoming deadline for compliance with the new Lead & Copper rules**. It may be a sizable effort for some systems; you should look into it if you haven't started already. You can find the details on the <u>DOH website</u> which includes links to the technical and compliance requirements along with information about grants and other funding options. The March <u>ODW newsletter</u> includes some additional updates as well as options for technical assistance with the inventory and related communications.

Island County

- The Island County Long Range Planning team currently has one survey available on their <u>online engagement website</u>: **Natural Resources**. This element might be the most important one for WIWSA members as it includes a number of critical groundwater topics. There is also a comments section on the engagement site that is always open for public comment. Please respond to the survey and weigh in with your comments.
- Planning is currently bringing the initial discussion of the Natural Resource Elements forward to the Planning Commission and Board of County Commissioners work sessions. Watch the <u>Agenda Center</u> for scheduled meetings and the agenda if you'd like to participate.

Department of Ecology
